Background

St George has started construction of the new 'Kew Bridge' development at the former Scottish Widows site and The Thameside Centre provides an opportunity to continue the regeneration of this important riverside location. The aim will be to design a high quality, mixed-use scheme with improved access to the river, which is well integrated into the surrounding area. St George has appointed John Thompson & Partners as architects for the scheme and we will facilitate the community planning process.

Community Planning

Community Planning is a way of engaging with the local community and partners to shape the future of their towns and neighbourhoods. At the Community Planning Evening participants will have the chance to find out more about the scheme, meet the design team and take part in a workshop and hands-on planning groups to explore local and site specific issues and possible solutions.
