SILVERTOWN WAY, CANNING TOWN

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BACKGROUND

Canning Town and Custom House are undergoing a major transformation led by the London Borough of Newham. In 2013, the Mayor of London announced that it would be releasing 2.56 hectares of land south of Canning Town station and west of Silvertown Way for a high quality residential-led development, which benefits from good access to public transport. The redevelopment proposals include approximately 1100 homes, comprising affordable, private rented and for sale homes, and around 8000 square metres of commercial and community floor space, including a new hotel. Peto Street will be regenerated with a range of uses culminating in a new public green.

COMMUNITY PLANNING

In April 2015 local residents and stakeholders were invited to the Silvertown Way Community Planning Weekend to help create a new Vision for the site. People took part in workshops, walkabouts and hands-on planning groups facilitated by architects JTP to consider key issues and opportunities for the development and its relationship to the wider Canning Town and Custom House Regeneration Area.



PLANNING APPLICATION

Since the Community Planning Weekend the design team have been developing the proposals which will be presented at the exhibition. It is anticipated that the detailed planning application for the site will be submitted to Newham Council in early 2016.



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
